Joining the Southern Baptist Convention is an option

For over a year now since our church withdrew from the American Baptist Convention, we have been operating as an independent Baptist Church. During this time, the leadership of our church has been considering the benefits of joining the Southern Baptist Convention.

Before coming to Ohio, I was part of a Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) church plant in Madison, Wisconsin, called Red Village Church. This church plant was funded by the SBC in an effort to reach new people for Christ. As I became more involved in the church, I was able to see firsthand the great resources and coaching that the SBC provides to churches and the wisdom of being part of a support structure. Eventually this fledgling church plant got on its own two feet and eventually became a contributor to the SBC. As I learned more about the SBC, I felt as though it was a good fit for me not only because of the support they provide but also because it is a good theological fit.

The SBC believes in the inerrancy of Scripture. This important belief has been abandoned by many denominations that are now reaping the poison of liberalism. If you would like a copy of what the Southern Baptist Convention believes, you can pick up a copy of the SBC Faith and Message 2000 from me, or you can obtain a copy from the SBC website.

During my first year here in Ohio, I have checked in with my SBC spiritual "coach" in Wisconsin, receiving valuable input and wisdom in seeking to be an effective pastor here in Jefferson during my first year. My perspective of the Southern Baptist Convention has been positive to the extent that it has motivated me to attend the flagship Southern Baptist Theological Seminary located in Louisville, Kentucky. Since living in Ohio, I have had the opportunity to meet Gary Frost, the Southern Baptist area representative, over this region (Steel Valley), and I've been greatly encouraged. Gary had previously planted a successful church in Youngstown (Rising Star Church), later served as an SBC missionary in New York City, and has now returned to Youngstown to help revitalize this region (the area of Youngstown extending north to Lake Erie).

The Southern Baptist Convention has over 45,000 churches in the United States. A large majority of the churches are just like ours, with attendance under 100 people. Yet the SBC sees churches like ours as the key to denominational health. The Southern Baptist Convention not only plants new churches but seeks to revitalize existing churches and help them reach the community around them. There are two missionary arms of the SBC: the domestic mission board called the North American Mission Board (NAMB), and the International Mission Board (IMB) that sends fully funded missionaries overseas.

I believe that aligning with the Southern Baptist Convention is an important move for the future of our church. It will help place us on strong footing far into the future. On June 19 at 7 pm, Gary Frost and some members of the SBC will be at our church to answer questions and give you a chance to meet them. If you have any questions beforehand, feel free to ask me or any of the elders.

As you shop or garage sale in the coming year, please keep your eyes out for more plastic eggs, grass, and baskets for next year.




