Sunday Vespers at First Baptist Jefferson Come Back to Life!

One of the things that many of our church members treasure about FBC Jefferson is Sunday School. It's a time when you not only get to sit under great teaching but share prayer requests and get to know others in a more personal way. It's a time to hear from others, catch up on life circumstances and even pray for one another. If you look through the New Testament, there are over 54 "one another" statements commanded. Love one another, exhort one another, and pray for one another, just to name a few.

But many of these commands are difficult to live out in a large gathering on Sunday morning. There is too much going on. So, let me encourage you this summer to participate in vespers at 6 pm on Sunday nights, as a way of deepening Christian community and practicing being "one another." Here are three things that make vespers meaningful.

One, vespers are inter-generational. Sometimes on Sunday morning, we have as many as 15 children in Sunday School. Yet many older saints in our church never get a chance to interact with them. Speaking for my own children, interaction with older saints has been a great blessing in their lives, and they cherish their friendships with their older friends. Vespers is an opportunity for the older folks to build a "one another" relationship with young kids in a relaxed, picnic-like setting. Let me encourage you to meet someone this summer who is from a different generation than yours.

Second, vespers are an opportunity to meet someone new. Many folks use vespers as an opportunity to invite someone new to our church. It is more informal than a church service and a great setting for food and conversation. You can use vespers this summer to invite someone new or meet someone new, offering an opportunity for you to "encourage one another" at a vespers event.

Lastly, vespers are an opportunity for you to deepen your involvement in Christian community. Wednesday prayer time, Sunday School, and luncheons are all great opportunities for community. The summer vespers offer yet another touch point for deepening friendship and encouraging each other's faith. There are several vespers on the calendar, and I hope you take advantage of these great times of fellowship this summer. You won't be disappointed.

Bill and Ann Clemmer, Missionary Outreach for June 2019



The missionary outreach this month is Bill and Ann Clemmer who currently reside in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) on the Congo-Rwanda border and work with IM partners Heal Africa and IMA World Health in the town of Goma.

Bill regularly travels to Beni, where he leads an international team of doctors, nurses and technical personnel responding to the current Ebola crisis, the largest in Congo's history. On May 24, Bill was interviewed on "CBS This Morning" by Debra Patta. "I have never been in a context where people throw rocks at our vaccination team, where they block roads, where they loot and pillage our health care facilities," he said.

Ann serves in Goma with Congolese colleagues in responding to the numerous needs, including counseling, nutrition and educating orphans, refugees and other vulnerable children who are affected by the ongoing conflict and poverty in this part of the world.

"YOU ARE THE HEROES!" Operation Christmas Child

Last month I was greatly blessed to be able to attend Samaritan's Purse's Connect Conference in Columbus, Ohio. At this conference, year-round Operation Christmas Child volunteers have many wonderful oppor-

tunities--training sessions, information on upcoming changes, times of worship and prayer, great food and fellowship, and the chance to hear Full Circle Speakers (shoe box recipients) and National Leadership Teams (OCC leaders in receiving countries) speak.

On the first night of the conference, Neville Ramkissoon, Church Coordinator with Operation Christmas Child in Ghana, West Africa, declared, "You are the Heroes." He continued to passionately express his gratefulness for all the work that is put into packing, collecting and shipping the shoe boxes.

Raul, the National Coordinator for the Dominican Republic, spoke in one session saying that "the boxes are powerful." He said "It is not a simple gift. It is a powerful gift, the power of the gospel." He went on to say. "It is our eyes (who see the children), our feet (that deliver the boxes) and our hands (that give out the boxes but they are useless without the shoe boxes."

More than one shoebox recipient spoke of how the shoe box answered a prayer, fulfilled a need, or helped them understand God's love.

If there is one thing I took away from this conference and would like to share with you, it is that Operation Christmas Child is worth it. The effort put into packing a box, the time spent working at the drop off site, the money given to cover the costs of this ministry—they are all worth it. At the conference, I heard the speakers tell over and over again how much they appreciate all of you who pack boxes and help in any way. These coordinators are passionate about reaching their countries for Christ and they are passionately thankful for what you do. YOU ARE THE HEROES!


